On Publishing in IEEE Journals

Abstract

The IEEE Publishes about twenty five percent of the Global research in the electro technology area. However the impact of the IEEE Publications is more like eighty percent judging by the citations in patent applications and scholarly publications. In recent years there has been a substantial increase in the number of submissions to the IEEE journals from Asia and the Asia Pacific. However the number of papers published by researchers from India continues to be small in spite of the high caliber research as evidenced by the quality of NCC papers. In this light hearted presentation we speculate on the possible reasons for this small number. We then outline some possible measures to reverse this trend.
